

# ALABAMA NURSE WORKFORCE INFORMATION

## Alabama Nursing Education in 2014

- 9,365 students were enrolled in nursing programs in 24 nursing schools that responded to 2014 NLN Biennial Survey of Schools of Nursing.<sup>1</sup>
- 3,307 students graduated from nursing programs in 24 nursing schools that responded to 2014 NLN Biennial Survey of Schools of Nursing.<sup>1</sup>
- 2,350 qualified applications to nursing programs were turned away from 24 nursing schools that responded to the NLN Biennial Survey of Schools of Nursing, due primarily to the following *two* reasons:<sup>1</sup>
  - ❖ faculty shortage
  - ❖ other resource constraints

## Alabama Nursing Workforce in 2016

- 68,154 Registered Nurses reside in Alabama.<sup>2</sup>

In 2015, the Alabama state received Title VIII Grant of \$6,377,238.<sup>3</sup>
