

TEXAS NURSE EDUCATION & WORKFORCE DATA

Texas Nursing Education in 2014

- 26,623 students were enrolled in nursing programs in 38 nursing schools that responded to 2014 NLN Biennial Survey of Schools of Nursing.¹
- 8,424 students graduated from nursing programs in 38 nursing schools that responded to 2014 NLN Biennial Survey of Schools of Nursing.¹
- 7,355 qualified applications to nursing programs were turned away from 38 nursing schools that responded to the NLN Biennial Survey of Schools of Nursing, due primarily to the following *two* reasons:¹
 - ❖ faculty shortage
 - ❖ other resource constraints

Texas Nursing Workforce in 2016

- 101,972 licensed PNs reside in Texas (2015).²
- 288,843 registered nurses are actively licensed in Texas (2015).²

In 2015, the Texas state received Title VIII Grant of \$6,064,565.³
