Award Description

The CGFNS – NLN Distinguished Emerging Nursing Scholar Award has been developed to recognize and encourage emerging scholars who have pursued research studies in the advancement of nursing education and learning. The establishment of this monetary award is to enable emerging scholars to launch a career in nursing education research as the basis to inform teaching and learning processes across educational systems with promising global impact.

Eligibility

- Applicant must have completed their doctoral research dissertation within two years of the award application deadline.
- Applicant's completed doctoral research dissertation topic can come from any discipline with a dedicated focus on nursing education.
- Applicant can be from any country in the world. Special consideration will be given to researchers from low- and middle-income countries.
- Applicant must complete the application as listed on the NLN website.

Application Requirements Checklist

Each proposal must include the content areas below. Carefully review this checklist and rubric. Incomplete applications will be disqualified.

1. Summary of the applicant's dissertation (Max. 10 pages)

Including:

- o Summary
- o Statement of need
- Research hypothesis
- o Literature review
- o Methodology
- o Results
- o Conclusions
- o Implications for further research
- 2. Statement from the applicant outlining future trajectory of research (Including how the applicant plans to use the remainder of the funds to support new or continuing research, Max. 250 words)
- 3. Recommendation from the dissertation advisor addressed to the NLN Foundation. (Max. 500 words)

Please note that there is not a specific application template, however, each application should attempt to follow the order of the checklist and <u>use headings</u> indicative of these requirements. <u>Incomplete applications will be automatically disqualified.</u>
