

## NLN Nursing Education Research Grants Program

## Award Guidelines for Final Report

Upon completion of the research project, all Grantees are strongly encouraged to submit an abstract for a poster/podium presentation at the next available NLN Education Summit or the NLN Nursing Education Research Conference (NERC)\*. The NLN Summit and NLN NERC submission information will be available on the NLN website.

- Upon completion of the research study, all Grantees must submit a final Abstract (no more than 250 words).
  - The abstract should be written for publication on the NLN Website
  - Consider copyright privileges and do not submit an abstract for the NLN website that has been submitted for publication elsewhere
  - o All abstracts must be an original document
  - Abstracts should include:
    - Purpose or aim of study
    - Background, methods, design, instruments, procedure, and data analysis
    - Study results or findings and conclusions
    - How these findings advance the science of nursing education
    - Recommendations and plans for further research
- Please submit the final Abstract to the NLN Nursing Education Research Grants Program at research@nln.org by the due date designated by NLN Staff. Please type final Abstract\_<last name of PI> in the subject line. Questions related to this report should be directed to research@nln.org.
- To close the grant award, all Grantees must complete the survey emailed to them by the NLN. Survey link will be sent after receipt of final Abstract.
- The NLN retains first right of refusal for publication resulting from the funded research by encouraging the Grantee to submit a manuscript to *Nursing Education Perspectives* for peer review and possible publication.
- The Grantee must acknowledge NLN support of their research study in all public forums and dissemination venues, including all publications, abstracts, and presentations.
